### MORE TAX AND SPEND FOR CALIFORNIA

I know the majority of you will be ok with the latest tax increase for the funding of Cap and Trade to curb carbon emissions in California and to save the planet. Yes, we will but I have to wonder what happens when the wind blows from our next door neighbors Arizona, Nevada and Oregon that have yet to decide to save the world from carbon emissions.

In mid July 2017 the State legislator, including the RINOs (*Republican In Name Only*) voted to increase gas taxes by .63 to .90 cents per gallon and 10 to 20 percent on electricity.

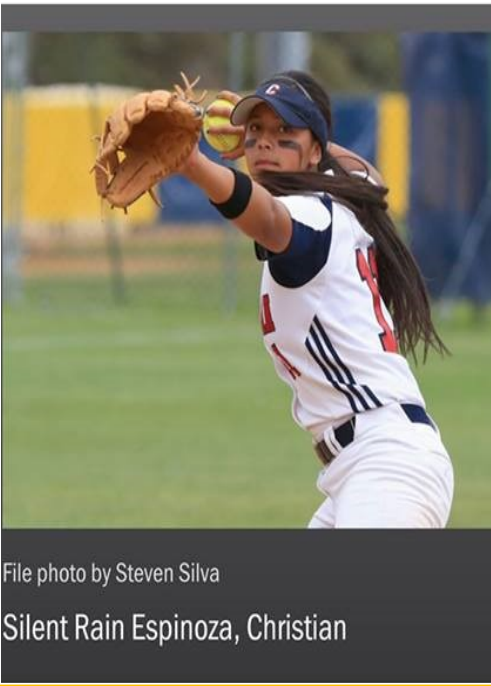
### VIEJAS, SILENT RAIN ESPINOZA NAMED ALL AMERICAN FIRST TEAM

Today, many tribes wrestle with the legacy of blood quantum and "Indian" identity, as they work to manage tribal enrollment and social services.

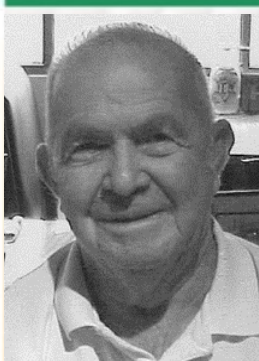

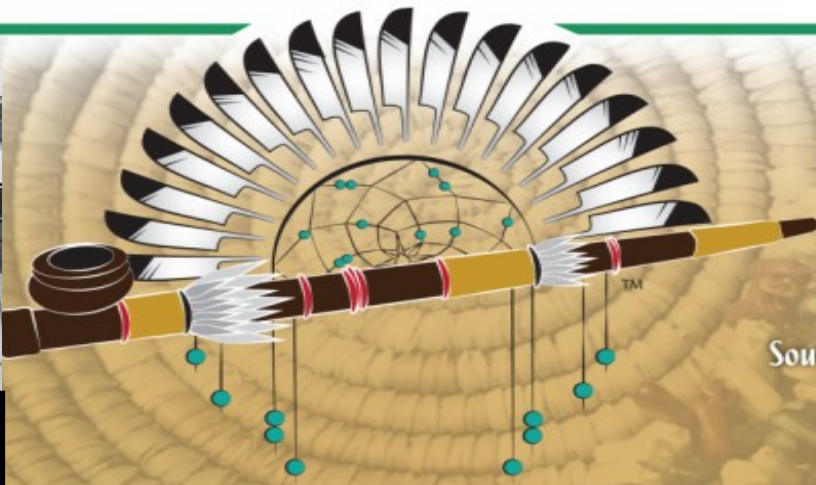

## SCAIR "GATHERING OF NATIVE AMERICANS" GONA

The Southern California American Indian Resource Center, Inc. (SCAIR) held its annual Gathering Of Native Americans (GONA) on June 28, 2017 at Santee Lakes Recreation Preserve. The activity was sponsored in part by the California Department of Education and U.S. Department of Labor. Funding for the Classy Green Sports Wear was contributed by PAF Associates of Santee, CA.

The primary goal of the **Family GONA** is to stem the cycle of poverty within the Native American Indian community in San Diego County. In an effort to achieve this goal as a component of its employment training curriculum SCAIR implements two **Family GONA's** annually.

The **SCAIR Family GONA's** includes the extended community family of elders, adults, parents and youth. The GONA curriculum is designed to develop positive self-esteem, goal setting, traditional tribal values and tribal cultural awareness for the Native American Tribal community in east San Diego County.

The objectives are: 1) to promote American Indian Education, 2) to increase awareness of the employment training

Program, 3) to increase awareness of the importance of tribal leadership, 4) to promote unity within the Native American Tribal Community, 5) to promote the understanding and importance of traditional tribal customs & values, and 6) to increase the self-sufficiency and employability of the individual.

Cultural resilience is a relatively new term, but it is a concept that predates the so-called "discovery" of Native American people. The elders teach that children are gifts from the Creator and it is the family, community, school, and tribe's responsibility to nurture, protect, and guide them. Thus, resilience is not new to the Native people; it is a concept that has been taught for centuries. The word is new; the meaning is old.

In spite of tribal differences, there are shared core values, beliefs and behaviors. Ten are highlighted here to guide our thinking about innate natural, cultural resilience: spirituality, child-rearing/extended family, veneration of age/wisdom/tradition, respect for nature, generosity and sharing, cooperation/group harmony, autonomy/respect for others, composure/patience, relativity of time, and non-verbal communication. (*Heavy Runner et al. 1997*).

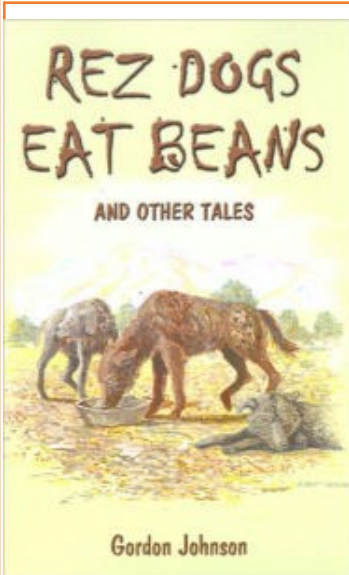

"Participation in the Family GONA events has increased each year and we are very happy to have the opportunity to serve American Indian community. Everyone enjoyed the stress free interaction with elders, families and children," Wanda Michaelis, SCAIR Executive Director told the *Soboba Indian Reporter*. "We also want to thank our staff, the SCTCA, San Diego State University, University of California, San Diego, California Department of Education and U.S. Department of Labor for their support in making the GONA a reality." It's a lot of work for our staff but just seeing all the happy smiles makes it all worth it," she added.

Over the past twenty (20) years, SCAIR has provided numerous educational programs for the Tribal community including Early Head Start, Even Start, the Soaring Eagles Pow Wow Dance program and Tribal TANF Job Readiness Training. The SCAIR computer Lab has thirty (30) computers and Dr. Brock the Computer Lab Training Instructor is also a Microsoft Certified Instructor for Microsoft Certification.

# My View—Your View

## WILL RIVERSIDE CO. SHERIFF CONTEST SOBOBA COMPLAINT IN FEDERAL COURT?

Please indulge me as I do my best Perry Mason imitation in my attempt to sort out the pros and cons of this dispute. First of all I don't think the question is *if* the Riverside County Sheriffs Office (RSO) will contest the Soboba Tribal complaint filed with the U.S. District Court; the question is really *how* will it defend its actions.

The Soboba Band of Luiseno Indians filed a complaint in the U. S. District Court, Central District of California on June 9, 2017.

The legal action taken by the Soboba Tribal Council stems from the alleged illegal actions taken by the RSO during an investigation on the Soboba Indian Reservation from May 26-31, 2016 of a missing person, (Jerome Salgado, Jr.) that was changed to a murder investigation.

The complaint claims that the RSO illegally entered the Soboba Indian Reservation and that it obtained a search warrant under false pretenses to search the tribal administration facilities for surveillance videos.

My Perry Mason assessment is that the RSO will claim that under the authority of Public Law 280 it has the legal jurisdictional authority to enter the reservation for the purpose of enforce crimes committed on the reservation.

Assuming that the RSO viewpoint proves to be valid, it would render the tribes complaint with the U.S. District Court claiming *"trespass and jurisdictional violations"* moot.

With regards to the Soboba Tribal Council's allegation that the search warrant was obtained under false pretenses, it is going to more of a challenge for both parties.

The RSO warrant was obtained after the missing person investigation was upgraded to a murder investigation.

Although only part of the testimony provided by the RSO investigator in the application for the warrant was available to the tribe's attorney as some of it was *"Under Seal."* What that means is beyond my current Perry Mason skill level.

The RSO investigator swore under penalty of perjury that the property to be seized – video surveillance footage stored on the tribes computer servers from cameras at the guard kiosk (*Booth*)—*"was used as the means of committing a felony," ... "is possessed by a person with the intent to use it as means of committing a public offense or is possessed by another to whom he or she may have delivered it for the purpose of concealing it or preventing its discovery," and "tends to show that a felony has been committed or that a particular person has committed a felony."*

And there lies the critical area of contention with the RSO. It appears that the RSO suspects a possible *"cover up"* or *"obstruction of justice."* This, of course, is only speculation on my part based on the testimony of the RSO to obtain the search warrant. 1) The absence of one hour and fifty-seven minutes of surveillance video tapes from the tribal casino for a critical time frame in their primary investigation of a missing person. 2) Because of the close family relationship of several members of the Tribal Council as well as tribal employees with some of the primary suspects in the murder of Jerome Salgado, Jr.

Given the seriousness of the crime all factors need to be considered.

However, there is no evidence supporting any *"misconduct or conflict of interest"* on the part of any member of the Tribal Council or staff.

The murder of Jerome Salgado, Jr., is still under investigation.

Regardless of all the pros and cons the tribal leaders see no justification for the full scale *"Rambo and Gestapo Tactics"* by the RSO Sheriffs nor the absence of any professional respect for the Soboba Tribal Government.

Ok folks that's my best Perry Mason analysis of the case. Let me know your thoughts.

## SAN JACINTO OK'S DOPE DEAL

The San Jacinto City Council recently approved the distribution of "Medicinal Marijuana" in an effort to increase revenue. My suggestion is why don't they try spending less.

As an strong opponent of the any legalized usage or sales of so called safe drugs, specifically marijuana for so many reason I will limit my objections to four.

1) It not only sends the wrong message to our children that it ok to use drugs, it sets a very perilous standard for the community. Adding to the absurdity, the mayor is quoted as saying that although none of the City Council members use marijuana, it's not opposed to others using it.

2) It is just morally wrong, plain and simple, to allow for the public usage of a *"Gate Way Drug"*. Of course many of the supporters defend its usage by comparing it to the usage of alcohol. I agree that alcohol is one of the most dangerous drugs on the planet, yet, I fail to see the justification for the legalization of another possibly less lethal drug for the simple reason of generating more money for the city so that they can continue to over spend. What will be the next "Not so Toxic Drug"?

3) **CONTROL & OVERSIGHT:** *Political Speak*, *"We will monitor and control"..."All efforts will be made..."* and *"Law enforcement has been directed..."*.

Wait! Let me put on my dummies sign. The reason the City Council is supporting this measure is to generate funds for the operation of the City *because they aren't able the control their spending*. Now they want us to believe they are going to maintain control over the cultivation and distribution of this drug.

4) **LAW ENFORCEMENT:** will be a nightmare and in reality almost imposable. Oh, I forgot for a person to be able to have *"legal possession"* of *"Medicinal Marijuana"* a person will need to have a certification."

Enter the criminal element to provide the forged legal documentation for those that are not able to obtain a *"Buy Dope Legal Card"*.

Shall we even bother to talk about how the drug pushers will almost be able to operate without any restraints.

## AMERICAN INDIAN HEALTHCARE AS A MODEL FOR UNIVERSAL HEALTHCARE

The following paragraph is an excerpt from the *Wall Street Journal* published on July 7, 2017. *"At the Indian Health Service hospital in Pine Ridge, S.D., a 57-year-old man was sent home with a bronchitis diagnosis—only to die five hours later of heart failure. When a patient at the federal agency's Winnebago, Neb., facility stopped breathing, nurses responding to a "Code Blue," found the emergency supply cart was empty, and the man died. In Sisseton, S.D., a high school prom queen was coughing up blood. An IHS doctor gave her cough syrup and antianxiety medication; within days she died of a blood clot in her lung."*

Most tribal people are very much aware of the quality of healthcare provided by the U.S. Government through the Indian Health Service. Some have even experienced the misdiagnosis and have suffered the consequences.

My most current experience was about three years ago. I had just lost my wife, Pat on June 22, 2014 and had been feeling a little ragged to say the least.

I went to the clinic and the doctor I preferred was on vacation so I was handed off to another doctor. The handed off doctor's diagnosis was that I was suffering for the flu and he prescribed bed rest and lots of fluids including Gatorade, root beer soda and raspberry tea were given the green light.

After about two weeks in bed with little sleep and lack of energy because I had to urinate every few minutes and food was tasteless, my daughter, Andrea and granddaughter, Ashley became alarmed and man-handled me to the Soboba Indian Health Clinic to see my regular doctor. Long story short—my sugar level was off the charts at over 500. Needless to say it, but by the grace of God my diabetes was rendered under control within a few months and the removal of any limbs was avoided as well as diabetic shock.

I don't mean to make light of the loss of limbs because I know others that were not so lucky after being admitted to the hospital with severe flu, only to wake up with the absence of a foot or leg.

Still another heartbreaking example for our family was with my brother, Bobby. I stopped by his home on the Soboba Indian Reservation on a Friday afternoon for a short visit—March 5, 2016 to be exact. I noticed that he didn't look to good and mentioned it to him. I suggested he get into to see his doctor. He told me that he had been to the clinic on Wednesday and the doctor told him he had a touch of the flu.

On that Saturday afternoon March 6, 2016, my brother, Bobby stopped breathing because his lungs were filled with fluids that were caused from the pneumonia he was suffering.

Historically, healthcare for the American Indian people has been lacking since its inception. A good example is the Soboba hospital disaster from 1927 to 1947.

During the 30's and 40's, the Mission Indian Federation filled complaint upon complaint with the Federal Governor. Long story short—my standard healthcare at the Soboba Hospital. The Federation was asking for the improvement of healthcare.

So what does the Government do? It closed the Indian Hospital at Soboba leaving the Southern California Indians without any health care. It wasn't until the early 70's under the Nixon administration that Indian healthcare was reinstated in California.

However, in all fairness Government run healthcare has never been successful. A good example is the Veterans Administration where the term "disaster" doesn't ever come close to defining it.

What is mind boggling is the socialist political movement for universal healthcare.

*"If you like your doctor, you can keep your doctor."*

*"If you like your insurance plan, you can keep it"* this was from the President of the United States of America bare face lying to the American people while trying to gain public support for his signature "Affordable Healthcare" legislation that was later branded "Obamacare."
