Purpose

The Leadership in Action Award recognizes a California Indian leader who has demonstrated a strong commitment, dedication and devotion to improving tribal governance and the community spirit of Indian country. The recipient must have demonstrated a genuine appreciation for the enhancement of tribal sovereignty, families and communities.

Criteria

The recipient will have shown a high regard for the enhancement of California tribal governance and community spirit by having demonstrated excellence in three or more of the following areas:

- Advocacy for tribal sovereignty
- Advocacy for tribal government improvement
- Advocacy for the safety of tribal families and communities
- Advocacy for improving education for Indian youth

Eligibility

The California Indian Museum and Cultural Center provides three awards on an annual basis, one in each of the following categories:

The Cultural Guardian Award
The Leadership in Action Award
The Emerging Leader Award

All current California Indian tribal leaders are eligible for nominations.

Nomination Process

An individual may submit more than one nomination to each category.

Completed forms and letters of nomination will be accepted through Friday, June 12, 2009 until 5 p.m.

A letter of nomination should accompany the nomination form describing a brief history of the nominee, a summary of their contributions to the community and how the community has benefited from their dedication, and how they exemplify the purpose of the award.

Letters of support from others may also be submitted.

Award recipients will be selected by members of the Board of Directors of the California Indian Museum and Cultural Center. Winners will be notified directly by June 19, 2009.

Purpose

The Emerging Leader Award recognizes an individual who has demonstrated the ability to reach leadership potential through competitive achievement. The recipient must have demonstrated academic, athletic, and/or community service excellence and show commitment to using their skills to improve the wellbeing of California tribal communities.

Criteria

The recipient will have shown a high regard for academic, athletic and/or community service achievement and their commitment to improving the wellbeing of California tribal communities by having demonstrated excellence in three or more of the following areas:

- Academic excellence
- Athletic excellence
- Community service achievement
- Cultural preservation/revitalization
- Creation/maintenance of community or cultural resources

Eligibility

The California Indian Museum and Cultural Center provides three awards on an annual basis, one in each of the following categories:

The Cultural Guardian Award The Leadership in Action Award The Emerging Leader Award

All California Indian and Native American (residing in California) elementary, high school and college students are eligible for nominations.

Nomination Process

An individual may submit more than one nomination to each category.

Completed forms and letters of nomination will be accepted through Friday, June 12, 2009 until 5 p.m.

A letter of nomination should accompany the nomination form describing a brief history of the nominee, a summary of their contributions to the community and how the community has benefited from their dedication, and how they exemplify the purpose of the award.

Guidelines

Purpose

The Cultural Guardian Award recognizes an individual who has demonstrated a powerful commitment to protecting, preserving and enhancing the cultural integrity of Indian tribes of California. The recipient must have demonstrated a dedication to tribal language enhancement and preservation activities that assure an intergenerational connection to culture and tradition.

Criteria

The recipient will have shown a high regard for the California tribal cultural preservation and revitalization by having demonstrated excellence in three or more of the following areas:

- Cultural protection, preservation and enhancement
- California tribal language preservation and revitalization
- The promotion of intergenerational cultural activities among community members
- Tribal cultural program enhancement
- Tribal cultural and historical documentation and/or exhibition or curriculum development

Eligibility

The California Indian Museum and Cultural Center provides three awards on an annual basis, one in each of the following categories:

The Cultural Guardian Award The Leadership in Action Award The Emerging Leader Award

All California Indians and Native Americans living in California are eligible for nominations.

Nomination Process

An individual may submit more than one nomination to each category.

Completed forms and letters of nomination will be accepted through Friday, June 12, 2009 until 5 p.m.

A letter of nomination should accompany the nomination form describing a brief history of the nominee, a summary of their contributions to the community and how the community has benefited from their dedication, and how they exemplify the purpose of the award.
