The travel scholarship program is designed to provide support for American Indian/Alaska Native/ Native Hawaiian students and researchers to attend the 2009 Native Health Research conference. Eligibility

Eligible candidates must be of a member of an American Indian tribe, be of Alaska Native or Native Hawaiian descent.

Review of applications will occur in June and recipients will be notified by June 30th.





Student Travel Scholarship

Eligible candidates must (1) be of a member of an American Indian tribe, be of Alaska Native or Native Hawaiian descent; (2) be an enrolled undergraduate or graduate student for the 2008-2009 school year:

Graduate students will submit an abstract for either poster or oral presentation on a current research project. Students will attend a preconference reception to network with other students and meet with mentors.


